How is the Middle Years Programme Defined?


The MYP:

- is a concept-based curriculum that supports structured inquiry for learning to promote meaning and understanding
- offers 8 subject groups, plus an 8th Grade Community Project

The MYP is a rigorous and challenging program that:

- encourages students to make connections between traditional subjects and the real world
- encourages students to become creative, critical and reflective thinkers
- fosters the development of skills for communication, intercultural understanding and global engagement.

Mathematics Flow Chart







Class Placement Exceptions

Any student scoring Level 1 or 2 on the 2021 FSA Reading Assessment will be administratively placed in Intensive Reading

Assessment

- Student work is assessed according to Miami-Dade County Public School grading scale: A-B-C-D-F
- Students are also assessed in a range of tasks using IB MYP assessment criteria for each subject area.
- In addition to a M-DCPS Report Card, students will also be issued an MYP Progress Report at the end of the 1st semester.

What are the Community Service Requirements?

6th Grade Students: 5 hours

• 7th Grade Students: 5 hours

8th Grade Students: 10 hours +

Community Project

These are the minimum requirements; however, students are encouraged to do more.



Community Project- 8th Grade

- Culminating activity completed in 8th grade
- Students are given an opportunity to develop awareness of needs in various communities and address those needs through service learning
- Students are expected to demonstrate skills and knowledge acquired during the three years of the MYP
- Students are assigned a supervisor to guide them through the process
- Project is assessed according to IB assessment Criteria

Requirements for <u>Completion</u> of the Middle Years Programme

In order to earn FCM's MYP Completion Certificate, students must:

- have grades of "C" and above in <u>all</u> subject areas
- fulfill the community service requirement in each year of the program (25 hours for this year's 8th grade)
- Complete the 8th Grade Community Project

Transportation availability is limited, subject to change, and may not be available to all students. When you applied to Frank C. Martin International K-8 Center it was with the understanding that transportation may NOT be provided.

- If your address of record is <u>within</u> the designated transportation service zone, your child is currently eligible to receive transportation service, <u>providing your residence is in excess of two</u> miles from our school.
- If your address of record is <u>outside</u> the designated transportation service zone, your child is not eligible to receive transportation services. If you accept an invitation to attend the magnet program, you will be responsible for transporting your child to and from our school.
- Please note should your residence and/or the transportation service zone change, your child may no longer be eligible to receive transportation services. Additionally, the provision of transportation services for magnet school students is reviewed annually and may change every year.
- The school does not handle transportation requests. Provision of transportation is determined by the Miami-Dade County Public Schools district.
- Transportation change requests will not be accepted during the first 10 days of school.

Home Learning Assignments


Homework is assigned daily.

Uniforms cont'd.

Jackets/Sweaters/Sweatshirts:

- May be worn provided that they comply with uniform policy
- Outerwear <u>must</u> be plain navy or gray ONLY (no design will be accepted)
- Hoodies are acceptable, however, for safety, no hoods may be worn on campus.

COVID Update 9 (As of July 28, 2021)

- Facial coverings will be required on buses. The wearing of facial coverings and social distancing outdoors while students wait for the bus will be a parental responsibility; however, both will be encouraged.
- Social distancing will be in place in cafeterias and alternate dining venues will be used when possible.
- A health screening room in all schools.
- Heightened cleaning and sanitization protocols in place on buses, school campuses, and District offices. Personal hygiene behavior, including frequent handwashing and the use of hand sanitizing stations will continue to be encouraged.

- Improved air technology, such as purifiers, ionization systems, and upgraded A/C units.
- Increased amount of outdoor fresh air coming into our school buildings.
- HVAC (heating, ventilation, and air conditioning) systems will run at maximum outside airflow for two hours before and after school buildings are occupied.
- Instead of quarantining entire classes or departments, the quarantine process will focus on individuals directly impacted by a potential exposure due to the availability of better science and data.
